Verbs with Human Objects

10.1 Dialogue.

10.2 Vocabulary: More transitive verbs.

?əlməct 'wait for him/her/it'

tiwi?əlt 'pray for him/her/it'

ci:t 'thank him/her/it'

cewat 'help him/her/it'

kwecət 'look at him/her/it'

kwənət 'take him/her/it'

?a:t 'call for him/her/it'

temət 'call/telephone him/her/it'

pasət 'hit him/her/it with a thrown object'

10.3 Third person objects.

As we saw in Unit 8, when the transitive verb has a third person object, that is an object translated 'him', 'her', 'it', or 'them', simply use the verb in the transitive form (that is, with the suffix -t).

10.3a The object can be a noun phrase. The noun phrase appears after the verb.

ni cən cewət kwθə swəyqe?. 'I helped the man.'
ni ʔə ce:p ʔəlməct łə qemiʔ? 'Did you (pl) wait for the girl?'

ni ct tiwi?əlt kwθən men. 'We prayed for your father.'

10.3b Transitive verbs can also be used without a noun phrase. This corresponds to an English sentence with a pronoun as the object.

ni cən ci:t. 'I thanked him/her.'

ni ?ə čxw kwənət? 'Did you take him/her/it?'

ni ct kwecət. 'We looked at him/her/it.'

ni ce:p nayəmət. 'You (pl) laughed at him/her/it.'

10.4 Third person subject.

Recall that when there is a transitive verb with a third person subject, the suffix -as appears on the verb. The object noun phrase can follow the verb. Or both a subject noun phrase and an object noun phrase can follow the verb.

ni kwənətəs. 'He/she took him/her/it.'

ni ?ə qaytəs? 'Did he/she kill him/her/it?'

ni ci:təs lə si?em. 'He/she thanked the honored woman.'

ni ?ə ?a:təs $k^w\theta$ ə nə men? 'Did he call my father?'

swiwləs k^wθə sqw?əqs. brother.'

ni kwecətəs kw θ ə swəyqe? 'The man looked at the woman.'

la sleni?.

10.5 First and second person objects.

When there is a transitive verb with a first or second person object, a special suffix is used on the verb. These suffixes are:

	OBJECT SUFFIXES		
	FIRST PERSON	SECOND PERSON	
SINGULAR	-θáṁx	-θámə	
PLURAL	-táľx ^w	-tálə	

The suffix for first person singular object 'me' is $-\theta \dot{a}\dot{m}x$. This appears on the verb instead of the transitive suffix -t.

ni ?ə čxw kwecəθámx? 'Did you look at me?'

ni ?ə ce:p ?əlməcθámx? 'Did you (pl) wait for me?'

The suffix for second person singular object 'you' is $-\theta \acute{a}m\partial$.

ni cən k wecəθámə. 'I looked at you.'

ni ct ʔəlməcθámə. 'We waited for you.'

The suffix for first person plural object 'us' is $-t\acute{a}\acute{l}x^w$.

ni ?ə čxw kwecətálxw? 'Did you look at us?'

ni ?ə ce:p ?əlməctálxw? 'Did you (pl) wait for us?'

The suffix for second person plural object 'you (pl)' is -tálə.

ni cən kwecətálə. 'I looked at you (pl).'

ni ct ?əlməctálə. 'We waited for you (pl).'

10.6 Third person subject + first person object.

When a transitive sentence has a third person subject, the suffix -as appears on the verb.1

Here are some examples of -as following the first person singular object suffix.

ni ci:θámxəs. 'He/she thanked me.'

ni teməθámxəs lə nə ten. 'My mother called me.'

Here are some examples of -as following the first person plural object suffix.

ni Pəlməctálxwəs. 'He/she waited for us.'

ni k̄wecətálxwəs kwθə swiwləs. 'The boy looked at us.'

¹Sentences with third person subjects and second person objects cannot be expressed with a transitive verb. See the discussion of passive in the next unit.
